

Things to see around Greenfield:



Adair County Courthouse & Veteran's Memorial

Designed by architect SE Maxon, the Adair County Courthouse built in 1892 is a two and half story brick building on a high limestone foundation. Limestone is also used for its decorative details throughout including the water table, belt course at the top of the windows on both the first and second floor, capitols above brick pilasters, and for the arched surround at the main entrance. The courthouse is located at the center of courtyard in Greenfield's Historic Public Square. It houses display cases with some county history as well.

The Adair County Veteran's Memorial is a granite display of listed veterans from Adair County. www.adaircouthiowa.org

Foster's Head Quarters

The Foster's private collection includes cars, motorcycles, vintage signs, neon lights, and other car memorabilia. Some of the cars you'll see in this collection includes a 1968 and 1973 Corvette convertibles, 1960 Impala convertible, 1970 Mustang Boss 302, 1975 Trans Am, a 1994 Impala SS, a 1964 Impala, and 2 1995 Mustangs. One of the Mustangs is set up for racing with a 650 horse engine under the hood and also in his collection is a 1967 GTO convertible that was originally purchased by legendary football coach and announcer John Madden. Henry A Wallace Country Life Center

Birthplace of Henry A. Wallace - U.S. Secretary of Agriculture from 1933 to 1941, U.S. Vice President from 1941 to 1945, and U.S. Secretary of Commerce from 1945 to 1946. He founded seed corn company Pioneer Hi-Bred in 1926 and was an editor at Wallaces' Farmer magazine. In 1999, The Des Moines Register named Wallace the "Most Influential Iowan of the 20th Century." The Center includes: 40 acres of the original Wallace farm, Restored Home featuring a gift shop & market, Iowa Prairie & Pond, Sculpture Walking Path, Orchard, Flower & Produce Gardens, and The Gathering Table Café. www.wallace.org

Iowa Aviation Museum

Located at the Greenfield Municipal Airport, the Iowa Aviation Museum is dedicated to preserving Iowa's aviation heritage, aircraft and memorabilia. The Iowa Aviation Hall of Fame, located at the museum, honors Iowans who have contributed significantly to Iowa's involvement in aviation. Warren Cultural Center

From the moment Ed and Eva Warren opened the doors of the Opera House in 1896, the building took its place as the "grand lady" of the Greenfield town square. With its expansive windows, oxidized copper accents, and distinctive turret, the three-story brick structure served as a landmark for culture and commerce. Though the ground floor continued to house retail businesses into the 1990s, by the late 1940s the theater space fell into complete disuse. Placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1979, efforts to restore became a \$6.2 million makeover, now serving the community as a multi-use facility, hosting meetings, receptions, overnight guests, and live performances. www.warrenculturalcenter.com
